- 29-summer program for ages 6-17
- 26-adult day support program (5days/week)
- 24-supported employment opportunities
- 20-after school program for ages 6-12
- 15-elderly requesting day support
- 13-requesting in house services
- Improved after school & summer programs may help lower the # of adults needing day support
- The number of adults needing day support
- Also if they are more employment opportunities

Mission:

- Improving the quality of life for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities
- Through education awareness advocacy and services

Needs they are meeting:

- Providing services geared toward the individual
- Building self sufficiency (handling cooking skills, etc.)

How they do it:

- Person center planning and individual assessment

How they Measure outcome:

- Individual service plan (ISP)
- Goals are specific to individual
- Daily progress notes and monthly data sheets
- Quarterly and annual reports
